The path to becoming a Landes Snowboard Instructor (Level 3) starts with gaining the qualification for the Snowboard Instructor Anwärter (Level 1+2). This qualification can be completed taking the 10 day Snowboard Anwärter course (Level 1+2) or the National Snowboard Instructor (Level 1) 5 day module together with the Snowboard Instructor Anwärter (Level 2) 6 day module.

This qualification is needed in order to continue through the both qualification systems Landes Snowboard Instructor (Level 3) and Alpine course. There are 10 days of practical work to do in a ski school during both qualification systems Snowboard Instructor Anwärter (Level 1+2) and Landes Snowboard Instructor (Level 3). A Landes Snowboard Instructor (Level 3) qualification is a prerequisite to taking the Alpine course module.

A successful completion of the qualifications together with the practical working hours leads to the **Snowboard Instructor Landes (Level 3)** qualification. This qualification is internationally regarded as equivalent to the international ISIA qualification. In addition a **Ski Anwärter** 5 day module can be completed in order to gain a **Snow Sports Instructor in Snowboard** qualification (**Level 3+**).

SNOWBOARD INSTRUCTOR ANWÄRTER – LEVEL 1+2

Course length: 10 days

The content of the Snowboard Anwärter level qualification is the development of the educational goals starting with the introduction to "carving tipping turn" and "freestyle basics". In addition to this, participants also improve their own skills.

The main practical and methodical focus is on the subjects "Introduction", " Carving in different forms", "Short turn", strengthening the "Freestyle Basics", Fun Park, preparation for the GS and strengthening riding skills off piste. The future Landeslehrer also gains a huge amount of knowledge about the physical and psychological elements of snowboarding.

Organisation and Implementation

WIENER SKI- UND SNOWBOARDLEHRER VERBAND (WSSV) - SNOWSPORTS ACADEMY

Locations, Duration and Costs

All current course information is available on the homepage: www.snowsports.at

Trainers

All trainers have the highest Austrian training qualification - state diploma - Staatliche Diplomskilehrer (Level 4).

Course Completion

At the end of each course, examinations take place. The graduates receive a confirmation/certificate with the qualification of the attained level of education in accordance with the provisions of the Viennese State Law (Wiener Landesgesetz).

Registration and Registration Deadline

All courses are available online at www.snowsports.at. No spoken or telephone registration will be accepted.

Participation after the registration deadline is only possible if free places are available. The application is binding. (further information in the conditions of participation and cancellation)

Training Documents

The official teaching materials can be collected directly at the course. During the Anwärter course the documents are included in the price.

Mandatory Attendance

The candidate is obliged to attend every day of the course. The course fees are a flat rate and there is no refund for late arrival or earlier departure.

Proof of Work Experience

A period of ten days working in a ski school is prescribed between the courses and must be proven with a confirmation from the ski school at the start of the course.

Membership

The membership can be purchased at the courses, on-site or online.

Age of Participation

Only persons who have reached the age of 16 may be admitted to the Landesskilehrer course. The examination however, can only be taken by those 18 years of age and over.

EXAMINATION RESITS

If a test is not passed, a resit at a Snowsports Academy course is to be completed. If more than 3 practical test parts are not passed, a complete course repetition is recommended. A resit must be carried out within a period of max. 3 years, after course completion, otherwise a course repetition is required.

Registration for a resit

Registration for a resit is only possible online at www.snowsports.at no later than 7 days before the exam day. The examination fee is to be transferred immediately after registration.

Meeting Point for resits

The dates for resitting an exam are available on the homepage. Participants in the reexamination are obliged to be present at the opening of the examination in the respective hotel.

Training camp for resits

There is the possibility to prepare for the resits as part of a training camp. The training camp will be offered for the Anwärter Ski (level 1+2), Anwärter SB (level 1+2), Ski Landeslehrer (LS1 + LS2) and SB Landeslehrer. There is also the possibility of a special preparation by the RTL-camp, off-piste camp or the mogul camp. Registration for a training camp is only possible online at www.snowsports.at
